### United Way HELP Fund Impacted Health for Local People

United Way Health Efforts for Local People (HELP) Fund supported six local health programs and projects through grants of up to \$10,000 in 2011.

End-of-year reports show positive health work in the lives of area people:

- •The CENTER's Electronic Medical Records program increased the number of individuals receiving needed mental health medication management by 260 people.
- •Through Heartland Regional Medical Center's Patee Youth Dental Clinic, 117 low-income children received surgical care for serious dental health issues.

Modeled after HOPE Outreach Ministries, Inc., United Way Reading Adventure was piloted in 2011 at Hyde and Mark Twain schools. On average every week, 30 volunteers read with 70 children at the two schools.

### ... (cont'd) Local Health Grant

Play Right enabled 164 children to exercise regularly and to learn about healthy eating and nutrition.

- •Through Second Harvest's Backpack Buddies, 70 St. Joseph low-income children received backpacks full of kid-friendly, nutritious food throughout the school year.
- •Social Welfare Board's Dental Hygiene Clinic provided a comprehensive dental exam, cleaning and education about diabetes and oral health for 117 low-income patients.

•Social Welfare Board's Diabetic Self-Control Initiative saw 280 low-income diabetic patients, 86 of whom were homeless, visit the Social Welfare Board an average of 3 times each to review blood sugar results and to receive glucose strips to help them achieve and maintain glycemic control. Patients were also provided with glucometers and received diabetic education. ◆
