Community Missions provided the Cold Weather Shelter for men and women this past winter.

































United Way Reading Adventure connected volunteers with more than 200 students during the summer months.






































In 2022, the local Legal Aid office closed 318 family law cases, including 30 divorces, 23 custody cases, 46 guardianships, and helped clients obtain 70 orders of protection.
