Success By 6[®] Works to Prepare Young Children for School Success

United Way Success By 6[®] is offering Kindergarten Jumpstart again this summer to families with children entering kindergarten this fall.

United Way Kindergarten Jumpstart invites selected families to participate and build their children's skills and confidence before they reach kindergarten.

Classes will be led by volunteer St. Joseph School District teachers and will provide parents with tools to teach their children kindergarten preparation skills in the weeks leading up to the first day of school. The program will be offered at various local library locations thanks to the generosity of St. Joseph Public Library and Rolling Hills Library.

According to recent kindergarten entry assessments, fewer than half of St. Joseph kindergarteners exhibit the skills expected of a 5-year old. Many children who start kindergarten without needed skills struggle throughout their school years.

The four-week program for children and families continues to grow and evolve each year to help prepare children for success. Last year, 16 St. Joseph School District teachers volunteered their time to help 39 families. Eligible families are being invited to this year's Kindergarten Jumpstart.

On a recent survey a parent said, "Kindergarten Jumpstart helped me learn how to provide support for my son when he enters kindergarten, and it provided me tools to use to help him succeed." Responses to the parent survey from last year indicated that the program was effective and much appreciated.
