

Exists to serve and to lift people in need to the dignity of self-reliance by providing support for people in crisis through emergency assistance, coaching, workshops and housing to help people achieve long-term stability.

Programs:

<u>Emergency Assistance</u> - Provides hygiene products, diapers, and support with rent and utilities for families facing financial hardship or risk of eviction.

<u>Employment Services</u> - Helps job seekers prepare for and secure employment through life skills, financial literacy and résumé workshops. Connects participants with employers offering living-wage jobs.

<u>Children & Family Services</u> - Offers maternity, baby and household supplies during pregnancy and through baby's first year of life. Provides rent and utility assistance with case management, adoption services and support for birth parents and adoptive families.

<u>Housing Services</u> - Offers permanent, scattered-site housing and case management for individuals experiencing a disability or chronic homelessness. Provides permanent community housing for low-income seniors with disabilities or special needs.

<u>Veteran Services</u> - Assists veteran families who are homeless or at risk of homelessness with housing placement, rent and utility assistance and case management to support long-term stability.

Children's Mercy is the region's leading independent children's health organization with a focus on transforming the health, well-being and potential of children by providing holistic care, translational research and breakthrough innovation and educating the next generation of caregivers. This office is home to 28 Children's Mercy specialty clinics including Cardiology, Endocrinology and Diabetes clinics and a growing number of telemedicine clinics. Attacks the root causes of homelessness using wraparound support to build self-reliance, decrease unnecessary usage of community resources and restore stability to people experiencing homelessness.

Programs:

<u>Permanent Supportive Housing</u> - Provides housing for men experiencing chronic homelessness. Men must have a disability and have been homeless totaling at least 12 months consecutively or on at least four separate occasions in the last three years. In addition, case managers help residents break barriers to stability and coordinate services.

<u>Outreach Services</u> - Outreach services are provided to individuals (both men and women) experiencing homelessness, providing resources in the community and help with items such as birth certificates, ID's, hygiene items and bus passes. In addition, outreach workers look for encampments throughout the area to ensure individuals are aware of resources available to them.

My Brother's House - Offers emergency shelter for both men and women.

<u>Aftercare Services</u> - Provides case management to persons who need help maintaining stability and permanent housing.

When you give to United Way you GIVE HOPE. Last year...

- Nearly 300 children and their families accessed early care and education programs, giving children the strong start they need to grow, learn and thrive.
- 150 children with a disability or special need and their families received services that help them reach important milestones and build brighter futures.
- 4,460 youth participated in out-of-school time programs where they found safe spaces to learn, make friends and gain skills that prepare them for success.
- 166 adults with disabilities found jobs through supported employment.

A Certified Community Behavioral Healthcare Organization providing an array of behavioral healthcare services including adult mental health, children and youth services, substance use disorder services and behavioral health urgent care.

Programs:

<u>Adult Mental Health Services</u> - Mental health services for adults with persistent mental illness who are experiencing disruption in functioning as a result of disabling symptoms of the illness.

<u>Children and Youth Services</u> - Individualized services based on the need of the child, youth and family to assist with emotional disturbance, mental illness or substance use disorders

<u>Substance Use Disorder Services</u> - An array of substance abuse treatment services for adults including medication assisted treatment, individualized outpatient services, group education/therapy, individual education/therapy, family therapy, co-occurring counseling services, co-dependency counseling, case management, peer support, diagnostic services, substance awareness traffic offender services, drug court services, trauma focused therapy, transportation services and gambling addiction treatment.

<u>Behavioral Health Urgent Care Clinic</u> - Treats both adults and children (age 5+) in urgent need of care for mental health or substance misuse. The clinic provides immediate access to behavioral health care and an alternative to the emergency room for non-emergency behavioral health care issues. (Located at 4906 Frederick Avenue)

When you give to United Way you GIVE HOPE. Last year...

- More than 6,000 adults and children accessed mental health services and found that hope and support are within reach.
- 366 survivors of domestic or sexual violence and 329 adults and children experiencing homelessness found safe shelter and connection to supportive services.
- 414 households received assistance with rent, mortgage, utilities or transportation to help them find or maintain stability.

Works to alleviate the effects of poverty/financial instability by providing services that help people meet their basic needs and function as capable, productive members of their community.

Programs:

<u>Early Care and Education at Mitchell Woods</u> - Reliable, high-quality education and care for children that meets the needs of each individual child and family in a safe, nurturing educational environment.

<u>Youth Program</u> - Out-of-school programming at three sites across town, designed to support and develop youth in the areas of academics, socio-emotional/physical/mental health and healthy interpersonal relationships. Programs offer daily meals, tutoring and homework assistance, STEAM and small group activities, supervised and open recreation, summer camps and weightlifting instruction, all while helping children build healthy relationships with adults and their peers.

<u>Individual and Family Services</u> - Provides immediate assistance for those seeking basic needs of food and shelter.

<u>In-Home and Professional Medical Services</u> - Provides caregiver services to seniors and persons with disabilities who want to remain living in their own home, including housekeeping, personal care, shopping and respite. Professional Medical Services includes medication set up and periodic health evaluations.

<u>Senior Nutrition</u> - Daily meals for seniors delivered to the home through Mobile Meals or served in a congregate setting.

<u>RSVP</u> - Volunteer program aimed at utilizing skilled senior volunteers to address specific community issues and create community impact.

Works to improve the lives of individuals and their families by meeting their human and social service needs.

Programs:

Help Me Hotline - A 24-hour service directing persons needing information/ assistance to appropriate health and human services. Advocates/coordinates services at multiple agencies and monitors availability of services.

Adopt-A-Family Christmas - Helps families and individuals enjoy the Christmas holidays who otherwise would not be able to provide Christmas for their families/ self by matching people who are able to provide support to those families and individuals in need.

<u>Soles for Christ</u> - Provides a free pair of shoes to school-age children before the beginning of the school year.

Other Programs: Diaper Depot, Seasonal Services (fans, space heaters, air conditioners) and Lions Club eyeglasses.

Promotes injury prevention and safety best practices by planning, implementing, and assisting with activities designed to decrease the number of accidents and increase citizen safety.

Programs:

<u>Traffic Safety</u> - Initiatives focused on promoting traffic safety through education, including Driver's Education, driving lessons, Permit Academy, car seat safety education, driver training for school bus and occupational drivers, docudramas, substance awareness programs for traffic offenders, and the Think First Traffic Offender Program.

<u>Community Safety</u> - Programs dedicated to preventing accidental injuries and fatalities via public education and awareness efforts, such as Safety Town, Safety Acres, active shooter response training, de-escalation training and private probation services.

<u>Occupational Safety</u> - Training programs and events designed to support employers in creating safer workplaces for employees and ensuring compliance with OSHA standards.

A multi-faceted agency providing emergency shelter for families with minor children, emergency assistance, food pantry, Pathway of Hope program, spiritual and life skills, Community Center and residential camp opportunities.

The Booth Center - A nine unit emergency shelter serving families experiencing homelessness with at least one child under the age of 18. Low to zero income families, lacking access to financial/housing resources, who would remain homeless but for the shelter are prioritized. The on-site case manager assists the families in developing a housing stability plan to address housing barriers, increase income and increase access to community/mainstream resources.

Emergency Assistance - Emergency assistance provided includes a food pantry, rental assistance for currently homeless (if available), clothing vouchers (twice monthly, unless extenuating circumstances arise), other basic needs as well as coats during winter months. In addition, school supplies are distributed to area students and the Angel Tree Christmas Assistance program provides

Christmas gifts to children that might otherwise miss out.

Youth Programs - A safe environment to develop life skills, positive social and communication habits and the opportunity to experience and learn new skills.

Provides outpatient mental health services to anyone in the community, regardless of the ability to pay, including mental health assessments, diagnosis and treatment, professional counseling, medication management, faith-based collaborative care, substance abuse treatment and autism testing.

Scouting prepares all youth for life by strengthening self-reliance, self-confidence and leadership skill development.

Programs:

<u>Traditional Scouting</u> - Scouting offers experiences that help prepare youth for their future by developing academic skills, self-confidence, ethics, leadership skills and citizenship skills that influence their adult lives.

<u>Camping</u> - The camping program is held at Camp Geiger just minutes north of St. Joseph.

Provides early intervention services, employment and life skills training to individuals with disabilities to enhance their independence and quality of life.

Programs:

<u>Children's Programs</u> - Provides pediatric physical, occupational and speech therapy; integrated preschool for children ages 2 - 5 including children with and without special needs; therapeutic lending program offering therapeutic equipment that can be loaned to families and child care providers; and community education regarding disability related topics and issues.

<u>Adult Programs</u> - Life skills for adults with disabilities such as cooking, sports and using technology as well as community involvement that includes hands-on service projects.

<u>Employment Programs</u> - Employment services match the best possible work environment or training options with each individual's interests and abilities, utilizing a discovery process and job coaches. Summer Work Experience gives area high school students with disabilities entering their senior year an opportunity to experience their first job. All Students Achieve (ASA) is a collaborative program held at Mosaic Life Care designed to improve employment outcomes for high school seniors through classroom activities and an unpaid internship for students.

Programs:

<u>Youth Development Programs</u> - Provides a safe, fun and educational place for kids to go before and after school at nine sites, serving 13 elementary schools and two early learning centers. Youth sports for children ages 3 - 8 years, including soccer, t-ball, basketball, cheerleading, street hockey and flag football. Summer Day Camp is available for children

<u>Healthy Living Programs</u> - Programs include more than 40 group exercise classes per week, personal training and LIVESTRONG program to help cancer survivors become more active and get back to a vibrant life.

<u>Social Responsibility</u> - Provides kids, families and communities with the resources and opportunities they need to learn, grow and thrive. Offers a range of programs and services to meet the unique needs of each community we serve.

Programs:

Bliss Manor - Housing programs which provide subsidized housing and supportive services for women who are survivors of domestic and/or sexual violence and their children.

<u>Community Support</u> - Free services to survivors of domestic and sexual violence including crisis intervention, outreach, case management, personal advocacy, safety planning, emergency financial assistance, hospital advocacy, court advocacy, law enforcement advocacy and professional counseling.

Healthy Teen Parents Healthy Babies (HTP/HB) - Program serving pregnant and parenting teens ages 12 - 19 to provide stability and support so that they may reach their educational and/or workforce goals.

Shelter - Providing emergency shelter to survivors of domestic violence.









How United Way Works

Traditionally, United Way has been known for harnessing the caring power of community through giving, advocating and volunteering and is most well-known for the annual United Way Campaign that takes place each fall. Through the Campaign, hundreds of businesses and thousands of individuals make pledges to improve lives through the caring power of community.

The majority of dollars raised through the annual Campaign are allocated to the network of United Way Partner Agencies to help sustain their current programs and services. More than 170 volunteers are involved in deciding how those donor dollars are allocated.

A portion of each year's Campaign contributions are held in a grant making fund called the United Way Community Investment Fund. Through this grant opportunity, area non-profits that meet United Way's criteria in financial accountability, program delivery and outcomes are eligible to apply for grants to further meet community or agency needs.

Giving to and through United Way continues to be one of the most impactful, effective and efficient ways for individuals and businesses to improve lives in our community. When the lives of our friends and neighbors are improved, we all are made better and our community made stronger.

A single gift to United Way does not impact a single agency nor a single program - it impacts dozens of agencies, hundreds of programs and thousands of individuals. Additionally, supporters and community members can rest assured that strong volunteer involvement and oversight ensures those receiving funding from United Way are:

- being held accountable for the dollars they receive from United Way.
- working together to reduce duplication of efforts and increase efficiency.
- considering new approaches to address the needs of our community.
- collaborating to meet unmet community needs.
