

The United Way Initiatives such as Leadership St. Joseph, Profit In Education, Success By Six, and Volunteer Center meet needs for adults and children in our community.

Community support was evident in the 2015 Campaign, led by Jason Horn and a group of hard working volunteers. The Campaign theme this year was baseball and what we can do using teamwork. The theme seemed even more appropriate as the Royals won the World Series during Campaign, and we exceeded our Campaign goal. Your United Way continues to be a national leader in Campaign achievements, something of which our community can be very proud.

As I write this note, the United Way Allocations Process is just beginning. Again, with the community support of over 100 volunteers, decisions will be made to recommend the funding for the Partner Agencies. EDUCATION

ONE STORY

Clayton was diagnosed with autism at an early age. With the help of a United Way Partner Agency, he received therapies and attended preschool to help him reach important developmental goals. During his early elementary years, his parents saw hope through another **United Way Partner** Agency that helped him learn life skills and socialize in ways not possible during the school day. Now a young adult, Clayton is a high school graduate who is learning the ropes of his first job, and he is an Eaale Scout-all dreams that would have seemed out of reach without the United Way system of agencies working in our community.

BIG PICTURE

United Way of Greater St. Joseph works to help people of all ages reach their potential through a variety of educational pursuits that will, in turn, strengthen our community. Quality early learning, youth education in and out of the classroom, and other instruction for life-long learning are just a few ways United Way supports education.

WIDER LOOK

- ▶621 children received early care and education to help them begin their school years ready to learn.
- ▶ 170 children with a disability or special need and their families received services that helped the children work toward important developmental milestones.
- ▶358 families and caregivers were educated about car seats and proper installation to keep children safe while riding in motor vehicles.
- Through education, 54 parents with at-risk pregnancies improved their ability to provide quality parenting for their infants.
- ▶1,037 students participated in afterschool youth programs.

HEALTH

ONE STORY

After serving multiple terms of military service in Afghanistan, David's life fell apart in the wake of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. Relationships and income crumbled as he stepped into substance abuse. He found his way to a United Way Partner Agency after he had been homeless for a time. With professional support and controlled medication for his mental health needs. he found services that helped him start over. He now has housing, is working two different jobs, and is rebuilding relationships as he lives each day with managed mental health.

WIDER LOOK

- ▶3,461 people received needed mental health services.
- ►502 senior adults received 105,323 nutritious meals to help maintain health.
- ▶1,173 women received mammograms or clinical breast exams.
- ▶2,826 people were certified in first aid and CPR.
- ▶\$26,279,324 in uncompensated medical care was provided to Buchanan County children.
- ▶1,944 people worked through alcohol and drug addiction recovery.

BIG PICTURE

In the Greater St. Joseph area, your contributions help people of all ages improve their physical and mental well-being. Health is promoted through fitness and wellness activities, nutrition and in-home services, counseling, and other important programs. Good health is crucial for everyone.





United Way of Greater St. Joseph focuses on education, health, and financial stability because these are the building blocks upon which quality life is built. Education is essential to obtaining and keeping a job with a livable wage. Good health keeps children on track in school and allows adults to be productive. Financial resources allow families to secure today's necessities and to save for the future. All three focus areas are essential to building a solid base for strengthening the community.

FINANCIAL STABILITY

ONE STORY

Angie is a hard worker who has been employed since she was 15 years old. The day after she broke up with a boyfriend, she learned that she was pregnant. Through United Way Partner Agency staff, she found the encouragement, quidance, and basic baby supplies that helped her form a financial plan she has been able to sustain. She continues to work and care for her baby, aiming to provide a stable future for them both.

BIG PICTURE

Stable household finances are important for daily living, which is why United Way of Greater St. Joseph also focuses on financial stability. United Way supports efforts for families and individuals in crisis. Such efforts include food, disaster relief, information and referral, and shelter services related to homelessness or domestic violence. United Way is also working to prevent financial situations from becoming problems in the first place.

WIDER LOOK

- ▶830 men, women, and children received 36,579 nights of emergency shelter.
- ▶ 330 people received budget counseling to help them through financial crisis.
- ▶ 391 low-income or elderly people were represented in court at no cost for non-criminal cases.
- ▶ 189 previously homeless households lived in transitional, permanent, or supportive housing.
- ▶111 adults with disabilities held jobs through sheltered and supported employment.

Donor dollars are working in northwest Missouri and northeast Kansas.

LOCAL IMPACT

United Way impacts the community, not only by providing services, but also by supporting Partner Agencies and by working to help the community come together in response to particular education, health, and financial stability needs.
Campaign dollars are allocated to seven United Way Initiatives and Programs, 18 Partner Agencies, and many other local programs. United Way supports services that aim to improve lives.

UNITED WAY INITIATIVES AND PROGRAMS

FINANCIAL STABILITY

Providing opportunities for individuals and families to become financially self-sufficient since 2009.

The United Way Financial Stability Initiative promoted free tax preparation services offered by United Way Partner Agency, InterServ. During the 2015 tax season, more than 1,500 individuals received tax assistance through InterServ. Preparers filed 206 Earned Income Tax Credit returns for a total of \$134,381, plus over \$1.2 million were received locally through tax refunds. Free tax preparation services help people keep and save their own money.

FAMILYWIZE® PRESCRIPTION ASSISTANCE

Saving residents money on prescription medication with a free prescription discount card since 2007.

The United Way FamilyWize prescription discount card can be used as often as needed by anyone for any qualifying prescription; it is like a reusable coupon for many different prescriptions.

In the first 10 months of 2015, people in the area saved \$188,776, or an average of 41% discount for each of the 8,942 prescriptions claimed with the card.

LEADERSHIP ST. JOSEPH

Building the skills of individuals to be effective leaders in the community since 1982.

United Way Leadership St. Joseph is an annual, year-long leadership development program for adults living or working in the St. Joseph area. The program helps create a network of trained individuals willing to engage in leadership and community service with enhanced knowledge of our community's opportunities, realities, and challenges.

In 2015, twenty-five community members completed the program, bringing the total number of program graduates to 800 since 1982. During the year, participants learned and practiced project development related to essential leadership skills. The class was divided into four groups and was challenged to learn the process of developing a project that would meet a community need. The challenge resulted in the following projects: a proposal to give children who live near or visit the Felix Street Square a playground; a project to identify potential, future downtown St. Joseph revitalization projects that could include the assistance of students in the Missouri Western State University's Griffon Edge fall program; a drive to collect gently used or new sporting equipment for the benefit of underprivileged youth; and a marketing plan to increase awareness of Big Brothers Big Sisters in our community.

The 2015 Distinguished Leader Award was presented to Class of 1994 alumnus, Tom Richmond.

PROFIT IN EDUCATION®

Improving the education level of the potential and current workforce since 1989.

United Way Profit In Education works to continue increasing the high school graduation rate by collaborating with and supporting education efforts across the community. In 2015, the United Way BEST (Business and Education Succeed Together) program served over 60 students, grades 7-12. Business partners worked with students and helped them learn about local businesses, different jobs available, required training, and education.

Also, United Way Reading Adventure was held during the school year with second grade classes at two local elementary schools and was held at three school-age childcare sites during the summer. The goal of United Way Reading Adventure is to help elementary-age students maintain and improve their reading skills and to help build their home libraries through books.

United Way Profit In Education committees are working to further the impact and reach of the strategic plan with a committee focused on connecting business and human resource expectations into the classroom through a Speakers' Bureau of business volunteers willing to speak with students about career fields and business and employer expectations.

SUCCESS BY 6®

Preparing children to be successful learners when they begin kindergarten since 1999.

United Way Success By 6 fosters and participates in community-wide partnerships to prepare young children for success in school and life. The initiative aims to strengthen the systems that nurture our community's youngest members by working with parents, childcare providers, early education teachers, and local businesses.

United Way Success By 6 hosted a variety of parent-centered activities in 2015, including the overwhelmingly successful early literacy celebration honoring Dr. Seuss; close to 1,000 people enjoyed early learning activities, a Seussical brunch, and a free book.

Resouce kits aimed to help parents facilitate their child's early development were distributed to 1,950 families with newborns and to 850 families with incoming kindergarteners.

Because the education level of early educators and childcare providers is a key factor in the quality of care provided to young children in their charge, United Way Success By 6 delivered over 2,329 clock hours of training to area childcare providers and early educators. In addition, United Way Success By 6 awarded 14 scholarships for area childcare providers to continue their formal education.

UNITED WAY INITIATIVES AND PROGRAMS

United Way's seven Initiatives and Programs bring the community together to address and prevent needs effectively.

UNMET NEEDS COMMITTEE

Collaborating to connect people to resources to solve immediate needs with lasting impact since 1993.

United Way Unmet Needs Committee meets monthly to identify alternative resources and solutions for cases brought before them. In 2015, representatives from non-profits, churches, utility companies, and government agencies as well as community members collaborated to help clients with needs for which there are few or no resources. Common needs were dental care and rental assistance. Through the work of United Way Unmet Needs, area people were connected to resources to help them gain and maintain stability.

VOLUNTEER CENTER

Connecting the community through volunteerism since 2009.

The United Way Volunteer Center is a central resource for volunteer needs across the Greater St. Joseph area. Individuals, groups, and corporations seeking volunteer opportunities can find a variety of options calling for varying commitments available at many different non-profit organizations.

In 2015, monthly CVRN (Community Volunteer Resource Network) meetings were attended by 15 individuals who manage volunteers for their non-profit organizations. United Way is building the capacity of community volunteer coordinators through the group. CVRN promotes and develops effective volunteer management programs in the community and enhances the knowledge, skills, and connections among members.

The seventh year of the United Way STUFF THE BUS! School Supplies Drive brought together hundreds of volunteers who collected over 23,234 packages of school supply items for students who needed them. The annual Holiday Volunteer Guide was created to connect those wanting to volunteer during the holiday season, and the agencies were grateful for the additional help.




