

Serves the immediate needs of individuals and families, addressing the immediate crises they face, and then offering robust services, thereby lifting them to the dignity of self-reliance.

Programs:

- <u>The Welcome Center</u> Provides emergency assistance in the form of food, hygiene and diapers as well as emergency rent and utility assistance to clients struggling to pay their bills and facing eviction.
- <u>Employment Services</u> Programs include help with employment, life skills and financial literacy classes in addition to resumé workshops and employment networking opportunities.
- <u>Children & Family Services</u> Mom's Empowerment program provides case management, utility and rent assistance and baby, maternity and household supplies for pregnant families through the child's first year. In addition, Catholic Charities offers adoption services and support for birth and adoptive families.
- Housing Permanent, scattered-site housing and case management for individuals experiencing a disability and chronic homelessness; supportive services for veteran families and permanent community housing and supportive services for low-income seniors experiencing a disability or special need.

Children's Mercy is the region's leading independent children's health organization with a focus on transforming the health, well-being and potential of children by providing holistic care, translational research and breakthrough innovation and educating the next generation of caregivers. Children's Mercy has dedicated clinic space at Mosaic Life Care in the Plaza 1 medical building. This office is home to Children's Mercy Cardiology, Endocrinology and Diabetes clinics and a growing number of telemedicine clinics. In addition, Children's Mercy provides NICU support at Mosaic Life Care.

Communit

Attacks the root causes of homelessness using wraparound support to build self-reliance, decrease unnecessary usage of community resources and restore stability to men experiencing homelessness.

Programs:

- Permanent Supportive Housing Provides housing for men experiencing chronic homelessness. Men must have a disability and have been homeless totaling at least 12 months consecutively or on at least four separate occasions in the last three years. In addition, case managers help residents break barriers to stability and coordinate services.
- Outreach Services Outreach services are provided to individuals (both men and women) experiencing homelessness, providing resources in the community and help with items such as birth certificates, ID's, hygiene items and bus passes. In addition, outreach workers look for encampments throughout the area to ensure individuals are aware of resources available to them.
- Cold Weather Shelter Offers overnight shelter for both men and women during the coldest months of the year. Dates of operation will vary based on weather.
- · Summer Program Offers showers, restrooms, hygiene products and case management during summer months. Serves as an access point for those seeking a housing opportunity.

Some of the ways donors improved lives through the United Way network last year...

- more than 600 survivors of domestic violence were provided legal assistance and advocacy.
- 4,535 youth participated in out-of-school activities and programs.
- 4,320 children received specialized pediatric care.

A Certified Community Behavioral Healthcare Organization providing an array of behavioral healthcare services including adult mental health, children and youth services, substance use disorder services and behavioral health urgent care.

Programs:

- Adult Mental Health Services Mental health services for adults with persistent mental illness who are experiencing disruption in functioning as a result of disabling symptoms of the illness.
- <u>Children and Youth Services</u> Individualized services based on the need of the child, youth and family to assist with emotional disturbance, mental illness or substance use disorders.
- Substance Use Disorder Services An array of substance abuse treatment services for adults including medication assisted treatment, individualized outpatient services, group education/therapy, individual education/therapy, family therapy, co-occurring counseling services, co-dependency counseling, case management, peer support, diagnostic services, substance awareness traffic offender services, drug court services, trauma focused therapy, transportation services and gambling addiction treatment.
- Behavioral Health Urgent Care Clinic Treats both adults and children (age 5+) in urgent need of care for a mental health/substance misuse. The clinic provides immediate access to behavioral health care and an alternative to the emergency room for non-emergency behavioral health care issues. (Located at 4906 Frederick Avenue)

Some of the ways donors improved lives through the United Way network last year...

- 5,011 adults and children received needed mental health services.
- 370 youth were impacted by a positive adult mentor.

Works to alleviate the effects of poverty/financial instability by providing services that help people meet their basic needs and function as capable, productive members of their community.

Programs:

- <u>Early Care and Education at Mitchell Woods</u> Reliable, high-quality education and care for children that meets the needs of each individual child and family in a safe, nurturing educational environment.
- Youth Program Programs that support youth in the areas of academics, relationships and health through building healthy relationships with adults, receiving a nutritious meal, tutoring and homework assistance, weightlifting and being part of a community.
- <u>Individual and Family Services</u> Provides immediate assistance for those seeking basic needs of food and shelter, along with limited services for immigrants.
- In-Home and Professional Medical Services Provides caregiver services to seniors and persons with disabilities who want to remain living in their own home, including housekeeping, personal care, shopping and respite. Professional Medical Services includes medication set up and periodic health evaluations.
- <u>Senior Nutrition</u> Daily meals for seniors delivered to the home through Mobile Meals or served in a congregate setting.
- <u>RSVP</u> Volunteer program aimed at utilizing skilled senior volunteers to address specific community issues and create community impact.

Works to improve the lives of individuals and their families by meeting their human and social service needs.

Programs:

- Help Me Hotline A 24-hour service directing persons needing information/ assistance to appropriate health and human services. Advocates/coordinates services at multiple agencies and monitors availability of services.
- Adopt-A-Family Christmas Helps families and individuals enjoy the Christmas holidays that otherwise would not be able to provide Christmas for their families/ self by matching people who are able to provide support to those families and individuals in need.
- <u>Fab-U-Less Finds Thrift Store</u> Offers reasonably priced new and gently used clothing, household goods and furniture to the public. Free items are provided through a voucher process when a person is unable to pay.
- <u>Soles for Christ</u> Provides a free pair of shoes to school-age children before the beginning of the school year.

Other Programs: Diaper Depot, Seasonal Services (fans, space heaters, air conditioners) and Lions Club eyeglasses.

Scouting prepares all youth for life by strengthening self-reliance, self-confidence and leadership skill development.

Programs:

- <u>Traditional Scouting</u> Scouting offers experiences that help prepare youth for their future by developing academic skills, self-confidence, ethics, leadership skills and citizenship skills that influence their adult lives.
- <u>Camping</u> The camping program is held at Camp Geiger just minutes north of St. Joseph.

- Traffic Safety Programs to educate and promote traffic safety including Driver's Education, Permit Academy, car seat education, driver training for school bus and occupational drivers, docudramas and substance awareness traffic offender program.
- · Community Safety Programs aimed at preventing accidental injuries and deaths by providing public education and awareness including Safety Town, Safety Acres, active shooter training and private probation services.
- · Occupational Safety Safety training programs and events designed to assist employers in providing a safer working environment for employees, as well as meet OSHA standards.

A multi-faceted agency providing emergency shelter for families with minor children, emergency assistance, food pantry, Pathway of Hope program, spiritual and life skills, Community Center and residential camp opportunities.

Programs:

- · The Booth Center Shelter serving families with minor children who are experiencing homelessness. Low to zero income families, lacking access to financial/housing resources, who would remain homeless but for the shelter are prioritized. The on-site case manager assists the families in developing a housing stability plan to address housing barriers, increase income and increase access to community/mainstream resources.
- Emergency Assistance Emergency assistance provided includes a food pantry, rental assistance, clothing vouchers (given every 90 days unless extenuating circumstances arise), other basic needs as well as coats and jackets during winter months. In addition, school supplies are distributed to area students and the Angel Tree Christmas Adoption program provides Christmas to families/ individuals that might not otherwise have one.
- · Youth Programs Provides a safe environment to develop life skills, positive social and communication habits and the opportunity to experience and learn new things.

Programs:

- Employment Program Provides jobs packaging, assembling and labeling
 for persons who have attempted and found that their job skills may not be a
 match for competitive employment. Provides a safe and understanding work
 environment where employees can grow their self-esteem and self-worth while
 learning how to manage public transportation, work with others, follow directions
 and develop job skills. These skills are developed while earning a paycheck.
- <u>Community Involvement</u> Provides numerous opportunities (at little or no cost to the employee) where employees can participate in community activities such as dances, musicals and sporting events.

- 455 senior adults received nutritious meals to help maintain health.
- 349 children received early care and education to help them begin their school years ready to learn.

Programs:

- Children's Programs Provides pediatric physical, occupational and speech therapy: integrated preschool for children ages 2 - 5 including children with and without special needs; therapeutic lending program offering therapeutic equipment that can be loaned to families and child care providers and community education regarding disability related topics and issues.
- · Adult Programs Life skills for adults with disabilities such as cooking, sports and using technology as well as community involvement that includes hands-on service projects.
- Employment Programs Employment services match the best possible work environment or training options with each individual's interests and abilities, utilizing a discovery process and job coaches. Summer Work Experience gives area high school students with disabilities entering their senior year an opportunity to experience their first job. All Students Achieve (ASA) is a collaborative program held at Mosaic Life Care designed to improve employment outcomes for high school seniors through classroom activities and an unpaid internship for students.

Programs:

- · Youth Development Programs Provides a safe, fun and educational place for kids to go before and after school at eight sites, serving 13 elementary schools. Offers a variety of youth sports for children ages 3 - 8 years, including soccer, t-ball, basketball and flag football. Offers Summer Day Camp for children ages 5 -12 on the campus of Missouri Western State University.
- Healthy Living Programs Programs include more than 40 group exercise classes per week, personal training and LIVESTRONG program to help cancer survivors become more active and get back to a vibrant life.
- Social Responsibility Provides kids, families and communities with the resources and opportunities they need to learn, grow and thrive. Offers a range of programs and services to meet the unique needs of each community we serve.

Programs:

- Bliss Manor Housing programs which provide subsidized housing and supportive services for women who are survivors of domestic and/or sexual violence and their children.
- YWCA Discovery Child Care Center A quality program to enhance the growth and development for children ages 6 weeks to 6 years.
- Community Support Free services to survivors of domestic and sexual violence including crisis intervention, outreach, case management, personal advocacy, safety planning, emergency financial assistance, hospital advocacy, court advocacy, law enforcement advocacy and professional counseling.
- Choices & Decisions Programs pairing vulnerable 7th graders with Missouri Western State University athlete mentors to discuss important issues and topics that affect them at school, at home and with their peers.
- · GRIT (Growing Resilient Independent Teens) Center A safe space for teens ages 12 - 19 offering a drop-in resource center, mentoring and outreach services.
- Healthy Teen Parents Healthy Babies (HTP/HB) Program serving pregnant and parenting teens ages 12 - 19 to provide stability and support so that they may reach their educational and/or work force goals.
- Shelter Providing emergency shelter to survivors of domestic violence.
