### YWCA Serves Local Teens and Their Babies

A program for pregnant and parenting teens at the YWCA has expanded how many people it can serve and has a new name.


The YWCA Healthy Teen Parents/Healthy Babies Program, formerly known as JUMP, can now serve up to 85 teen parents and their young children. In 2016, the program, under the previous name and different funding, served 70 teen parents and 60 children.

Buchanan County sees around 135 teen births each year.

The overall goals of the Healthy Teen/Healthy Babies program are to improve health and well-being for teen parents and their babies and to reduce social isolation. Specifically, the program addresses the social sources that affect access to healthcare, obesity prevention and mental health.

"The mental health piece of this program is huge," said Traci McChristy, the program's coordinator. "Exhaustion, many appointments and the need to get services to help support the baby along with continued education for young parents can lead to a tremendous amount of stress that the program aims to help offset for a healthier start and a healthier future."

To qualify for the Healthy Teen Parents/Healthy Babies Program, applicants must be a pregnant teen or a teen parenting a child under the age of three years old. To participate, teen parents need to complete an application for enrollment. They will then receive a newsletter for events, including

information about monthly support groups and opportunities. The YWCA will provide childcare if needed.

An Extension Nutrition Specialist with the University of Missouri and a health/exercise science student intern with Missouri Western State University work with the YWCA to promote wellness for the teen program participants and their young children.

In addition, mentors from the community are important to the program. "We're looking for mentors who have compassion and a caring attitude toward young parents and teen parents," said McChristy. "It's simple to help, and the activities are planned in advance for a once-a-month meeting."

The program was renamed in September after receiving a Community Connections Grant through Mosaic Life Care.
